



What Is SowBridge?

SowBridge combines electronic materials with live presentations from topic experts by teleconference 12 times each program year, typically on the first Wednesday of the month, and offers access to the recorded audio of all sessions to ensure subscribers don't miss a thing!

How does the program work?

- Prior to each session, participants receive session materials.
- Subscribers call a toll-free number to participate (This is slightly different for subscribers from outside the U.S. and Canada.).
- At 11:30 a.m. Central Time, sessions begin and last no longer than 60 minutes. Participants follow along with the presentation on their computer.
- At the end of the formal presentation, time is available for Q & A.

No Internet access needed to participate!
